Florida Medicaid recipients from birth to age 20 with disabilities and medically complex conditions are eligible for Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care (PPEC) services, for up to 12 hours per day.

The most common Medical Diagnosis that qualify for PPEC Services are the following:

- Seizures, Epilepsy
- Gastrostomy tube (G-tube), Nasogastric tube (NG-tube)
- Children with life-sustaining devices such as: oxygen support, apnea monitoring, central lines, PICC lines, etc.
- Cerebral Palsy
- Hemiparesis
- Quadriplegia
- Cardiovascular diseases, including congenital malformations
- Neurological diseases, including congenital malformations
- Diseases requiring continuous nursing care and supervision
- Status-post surgery
- Severe asthma
- Neonatal abstinence syndrome
- Congenital malformations
- Dyspnea
- Tracheostomy
- Difficulty feeding
- Failure to Thrive
- Dysphagia
- Spina bifida
- Profound autism spectrum disorder
- Profound global developmental delay
- Diabetes mellitus type 1 & 2 requiring regular blood glucose monitoring
- Medical conditions resulting in frequent skeletal fractures
- Hearing impairment
- Vision impairment
- Hydrocephalus
- Cerebral shunt
- Severe immunodeficiency, including HIV
- Severe symptomatic anemia
- Hematological diseases causing spontaneous or frequent bleeding
- Cancer, including leukemia, lymphoma
- Transplant recipient
